Canadian off-road racing team returns home to Vancouver B.C. with a 2nd place finish in the 45th running of the world famous BAJA 1000 Off-Road race. The team also secured the 2012 SCORE International Desert Series Class Championship making them the first Canadian team in the history of the sport to achieve such an award .

Every year the best off road racing teams in the world compete in the SCORE International Desert Racing Series. The race teams first meet in Laughlin Nevada for two short course events before moving down to the Baja Peninsula of Mexico to compete in the Baja 250, the Baja 500 and the world famous Baja 1000. This year celebrates the 45th anniversary of the legendary Baja 1000.

The 45th running of the famed BAJA 1000 took place on November 15-17th, 2012. This 1,121 mile race ran non-stop from Ensenada to La Paz. This race challenges man and machine against each other and the treacherous terrain that makes the Baja Peninsula of Mexico the epicenter of the off-road racing world. Over 200,000 spectators lined the course to watch 350 of the world's best off-road racers challenge the terrain and each other. Only 57 percent of the field made it to the finish line. YOLO Racing came across the finish line in 2nd place with a non-stop driving time of 35 hours.
